# Where to donate items

The first few ways to get rid of new and gently used items are to:

- offer them to family members and friends (think of all the circles you socialize in!)
- put them on the sidewalk with FREE signs—which is how Margaret Rosenbloom disposed of most of the old manse furniture
- post them on a website:
  - to donate (buynothing or nextdoor) or
  - to sell (Facebook Marketplace, nextdoor)
